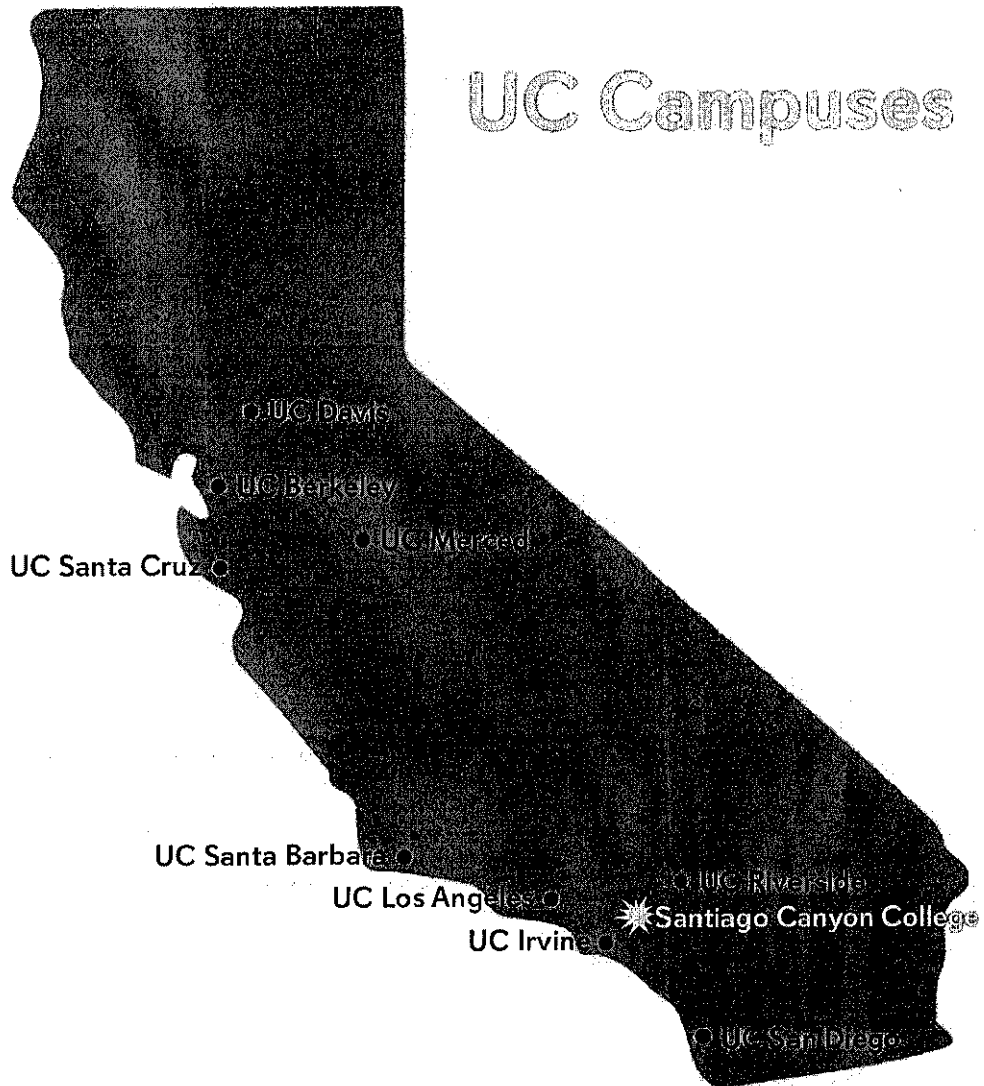

The California State University (CSU)

Access waivers through Cal State Apply application (for up to 4 campuses).
CSU does not accept any other fee waivers.

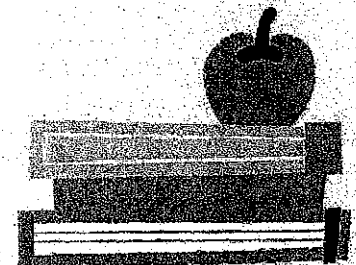

COLLEGE APPLICATION FEE WAIVERS

University of California (UC)

There is a fee waiver available through the UC Application and is automatically calculated after you enter your family size and income in the "About you" section. You will then see if you've qualified for an application fee waiver when you select your campuses in the "Campuses & Majors" section.

Those eligible for the fee waiver program are U.S. citizens, permanent residents, and applicants eligible for AB540 benefits. Fee waivers will only cover up to four campuses.

If you do not qualify for a fee waiver through the general UC application, College Board, NACAC, you should still submit the application through the "pay by mail" option.

Once submitted, you will email them with the following information: First name, Last name, Date of Birth, Application ID number, Explain your circumstance(s), Current household income, The number of family members supported by that income, Why you are requesting a fee waiver and

Any additional information you feel qualifies you for a fee waiver.

Common Application

Common App colleges want to make sure that application fees do not pose a barrier for any student who wishes to apply for admission. If you feel that your financial circumstances might qualify you for an application fee waiver, you can request a fee waiver in the Common App fee waiver section in the profile section. Any of the following indicators of economic need can qualify you for a Common App fee waiver:

- You have received or are eligible to receive an ACT or SAT testing fee waiver
- You are enrolled in or eligible to participate in the federal free or reduced price lunch program (FRPL)
- Your annual family income falls within the Income eligibility guidelines set by the USDA Food and Nutrition Service
- You are enrolled in a federal, state, or local program that aids students from low-income families (e.g., TRIO programs such as Upward Bound)
- Your family receives public assistance
- You live in a federally subsidized public housing, a foster home or are homeless
- You are a ward of the state or an orphan
- You can provide a supporting statement from a school official, college access counselor, financial aid officer, or community leader

Your counselor will be asked to complete a fee waiver form to affirm your request for a fee waiver. In addition to all these resources, you can always contact the college's Admissions Office directly for application fee waiver information.
